Notice of Adoption of a Development Plan Document

Kent Minerals and Waste Local Plan 2013-30 Adoption Statement

In accordance with Regulations 26 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that on the **14th July 2016**, the Kent Minerals and Waste Local Plan 2013-30 was adopted by Kent County Council. The decision was made by a full council meeting.

The Kent Minerals and Waste Local Plan 2013-30 is the principal document for the planning of mineral supply and waste management in the administrative area of Kent (excluding Medway) and sets out the long term spatial vision and strategy for suitable minerals and waste development in Kent up to 2030.

The Inspector's Report was received by Kent County Council on the 26th April 2016 and confirmed that subject to modifications the Plan could be adopted. The adopted Kent Minerals and Waste Local Plan 2013-30 contains all the Inspector's recommendations for modifications.

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the Kent Minerals and Waste Local Plan 2013-30 may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate powers and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made no later than the end of the six week period starting with the date of adoption (**14 July 2016**).
